Honoring Our History Florida East Coast Missionary Baptist Association, Inc.

One Hundred years ago, a group of devout African American Baptists, realizing that "in unity there is strength," met and organized what is now the Florida East Coast Missionary Baptist Association. The churches were from a wide area extending as far west as Sanford and Deland, running eastward to Daytona Beach and southward to Key West. The Association's main objectives are mission and education.

During the 1904 Annual Session held at Mount Bethel Baptist Church in Daytona Beach, the women marveled at the great work the brothers were doing and requested that they be organized. Their request was granted and the Women's Division was formed.

Due to the vastness of the district, rather than dissension, which is the consensus of opinion, the Association divided. The northern section chose the name of the Mount Zion N.E. Coast, and the southern section was called the Florida East Coast Missionary Baptist Association. Whereas Mount Zion N.E. Coast was to include all of Brevard and Volusia Counties; Mount Bethel, Daytona Beach and Saint Paul, Cocoa, retained their membership in the Florida East Coast.

The strength of the Florida East Coast Missionary Baptist Association has been enhanced by the strength of its leadership and the faithfulness of its member churches. Strong FECBA leadership has been demonstrated by Moderators such as Rev. Dr. W. O. Wells who traveled throughout the East Coast providing training and conducting meetings with church leaders and congregations. Dr. Wells was responsive to the needs of the churches and was designated Moderator Emeritus from 1995-2015.

We are also grateful for the service of Moderator Rev. P. W. Williams who focused on creating a greater spirit of "unity" among the churches. He encouraged the support of Florida Memorial College (now University), with an annual do-

nation of \$10,000. Moderator Williams was a visionary in his time and served the Association with dignity, grace and dedication.

Because of his warm and welcoming personality and his true love for people, Moderator Arthur Jackson, Jr. was a bright light in the FECBA. He worked tirelessly in service to the member churches and was sought out by others who wanted to make a difference in the community. Jackson encouraged churches to address the needs of at risk youth through the One Church, One Child initiative that found adoptive homes for children. In recognition of this mighty man, Rev. Dr. Arthur Jackson, Jr. Blvd. was designated in his honor. Moderator Jackson also served as President of the Florida General Baptist Convention prior to his passing in 2002.

If being Moderator of the FECBA is a sign of future success then Rev. Dr. C. P. Preston is a prime example of this with his recent rise to serve as the current President of the Florida General Baptist Convention. As a highly regarded pastor and visionary leader Preston serves with tenacity and dedication second to none. He is a recognized leader throughout the State of Florida and beyond. Always prepared and ready to make a difference in the lives of others is the hallmark of his ministry and leadership.

As the current Moderator of FECBA, Moderator Johnny L. Barber II, has made a meaningful and resounding mark on the Association. He holds the distinction of being the youngest pastor to be selected to have the leadership of the Florida East Coast Missionary Baptist Association entrusted to him. Barber is a focused, purposeful, and goals driven leader. With his youth comes the wisdom and knowledge to position the FECBA for generations to come. Recognizing the importance of enhanced communications Moderator Barber has lead the effort to create an impressive website, encourage the use of technology among the member churches, as well as devel-
